- _____’s Albino Skunk Music Festival got its name from the white skunks on the grounds of the original festival.
- Chicken bog is the tasty draw to the _____ Bog-Off Festival in Horry County.
- It would be odd if this tiny town located near Table Rock didn’t celebrate autumn with a Pumpkin Festival each year!
- Head east on Hwy. 76 from this town to drop in on the Annual Golden Leaf Festival in Mullins.
- The Eastern Carolina Agricultural Fair is 11 days of rides, fair food and exhibits in _____, the largest city in the Pee Dee.
- Fairgoers from this small town located between Clemson and Easley will head to the Upper South Carolina State Fair.
- If you love being scared silly, you’ll want drop by the Cayce-_____ Jaycees Hall of Horrors. (Hint: This town is Cayce’s next-door neighbor!)
- BBQ is the star at “Squealin’ on the Square,” held at this western S.C town’s historical courthouse square each fall.
- Just miles away from historic Charleston, _____brook Island is a private island founded in 1987.
- Once, Colonial families gathered every fall for feasting, games, music and fun. This tradition still lives at Harvest Fest at Johns Island County Park, located near this charming city.
- If you’re in the mood for German food, visit _____’s Oktoberfest, held near the town’s well-known Opera House.
- People from more than 60 countries and more than 100 international businesses call this Upstate town home. To celebrate this diversity, the city hosts an International Festival each fall.
- Steeplechasing is BIG in this horse-loving city! The _____ Fall Steeplechase has been held here since 1930!
- Salute the men and women stationed at Shaw Air Force Base in _____ this September at Shaw Fest.
- People take to the streets each September in _____ for this town’s annual Okra Strut.
- This Colleton County town hosts storytelling event “Salkehatchie Stew” in October at the S.C. Artisans Center.
- Grab your compass! Don’t get misled by the name of this town! It’s actually in the southern region of S.C.
- Art’Oberfest in _____ combines art with a German-styled family-friendly Oktoberfest.
- The Trillium Arts Festival held in this northern Greenville County town celebrates local folk art.
- Your mama always said to eat your greens! You’ll find plenty of leafy greens at the _____ Collard Festival.
- Take a ride on a miniature replica steam engine at this Greenville neighbor’s Heritage Park.
- Cheer on the Coastal Carolina University Chanticleers in this Grand Strand town.
- Known for its quirky art community and natural river beauty, it’s the harvest of shrimp that this coastal town honors during its fall festival.
- During the Bush-N-Vine Pumpkin Festival you can head out into the fields to find the perfect jack o’lantern and take a hay ride, too! You’ll find the festival in a town with the same name as this county.
- Head south from _____ Beach on the Grand Strand to the lovely Brookgreen Gardens this October for Harvest Home Festival Weekend.
- The South Carolina Jazz Festival celebrates the birthday of Dizzy Gillespie, born in this South Carolina town.
- If you find yourself passing through this town located on the Edisto River, stop to learn about its history at the Hooten-Black House (circa 1880). You’ll discover this town is located in SC’s smallest county.
- Listen as storytellers recount legends from the American Revolution to the present day, by the flickering light of the campfire at this mid-state town’s October event.
